Alumni **Report**

Fraternity Alumni Having Positive Impact

Working together since February to help UNC fraternities survive and thrive in these challenging times, we are starting to see some small steps of progress.

As chairman of the 53-person UNC Fraternity Alumni Advisors Committee, I've been asked by Rick Hopkins to update Beta Deke. I am pleased to do so because we have some good news to relate.

Working closely with the Chapel Hill Police Department, the UNC campus police, and the Office of Greek Affairs, we were able to reduce to almost zero the number of problems experienced during huge parties traditionally held the first night of school in the fall. We hope that this partnership can serve as a model for other large events so that the fraternities can party all night long if they want to but can do it safely and within the town's laws on noise and open containers of alcohol.

Second, led by a fire safety committee chaired by our Beta Deke Robert Poitras, we were successful in the fraternities doing much, much better with fire code inspections this fall. The houses' adherence to fire codes had been going down hill in recent years. The brothers' attitudes about fire safety had slipped to dangerous levels. That has been reversed through the alumni's hands-on work with their houses.

Even the normally antifraternity *Daily Tar Heel* came out with a story praising us for the progress. It quoted both the fire marshals and Director of Greek Affairs' saying the alumni involvement made the difference.

Not all the news is good, however. Though a few houses such as DKE did well in rush this fall, most houses did not. Overall, numbers of young men joining UNC fraternities continues to dwindle. We are quite alarmed. Therefore, we as alumni are leading an effort to form a single-purpose task force to study improvements to the way rush is conducted. Each interest group, ranging from alumni to the IFC to the Board of Visitors, will have one or two members on the task force. We hope that the brothers' wishes are followed, but we also know there are a lot of strong opinions out there about rush.

We are also quite worried about a vacuum of leadership from the IFC. It is not where it should be in the areas of leadership and self-governance. Recently the IFC president resigned under pressure from his peers, and we are hopeful that the upcoming election will produce a group of officers we can work well with to improve the system.

We are also a long way from making improvements to house security, hazing, and other issues. Small steps are good, however, and we are encouraged.


