From DKE to the NFL: A Profile of Jeb Terry '03

Editor's Note: As we went to press, Jeb was chosen by Tampa Bay, round 5, pick 14, overall pick 146, as offensive guard. Congratulations Jeb!

It's a childhood dream for so many boys — playing in the National Football League But for Jeb Terry '03, former offensive guard for the North Carolina football team, it should become reality during the NFL draft, held April 24-25. Terry's got his own contingent of fans in the Delta Kappa Epsilon house.

"I know I will stay in touch with guys from the fraternity," he says. "They have all been real interested in my career and really supportive of it."

That Terry counts his DKE brothers as close friends and a source of support demonstrates that he got from the fraternity what he was looking for when he joined.

"I wanted to get to know some people outside of football," he says. "It's a totally different atmosphere from the football crowd, and I think it helped to balance me out over my career."

And what a career it was. Terry was elected a co-captain in his senior year and

was named second team All-ACC. He counts beating Florida State at home, beating Auburn in the Peach Bowl and the loss to Texas at home in a night game among

his best football memories. But he has fond memories of the fraternity as well.

"My favorite memories would have to be all of the Halloween parties," he says. "We always threw a big Halloween party and those are some of my fonder memories." Terry declined to elaborate on some of the costumes that would appear at these events. Maybe some things are best left a secret. ...

What is no secret is Terry's ambition to succeed, in the NFL and beyond. Terry

graduated in December 2003 with a degree in business, but looks to NFL football as his first career stop. He hopes to be chosen

on the first day of the draft and is confident he will get drafted. However, when or by whom is up in the air.

"I'd love to come back home and play for Dallas," he says. "I've had a bunch of individual workouts (for NFL teams), but right now it's up in the air. I'll just have to wait until draft day." Though Terry will have to wait, it seems a consensus that someone will pick him up. NFLDraftBlitz. com rates him among the top 10 offensive guard prospects, and he was named "the best pass protecting offensive guard in the country" by USA Today's Sports Weekly.

In preparation for draft day, Terry has been training hard. He worked out twice a day while training in Louisiana during

January and February, including one and a half hours of running in the morning and two hours of lifting in the afternoon. He played in the Senior Bowl, an all-star game

in Mobile, Ala., and then worked out at the NFL combines in Indianapolis and at a pro-day in Chapel Hill, N.C. Scouts have contacted his agent to schedule individual workouts as well.

"It's pretty fun, and I am very excited about the draft," he says.

Once his playing days are done, Terry is considering a return to graduate school for an MBA.

President's Letter

UNC Creates 'Challenging' Environment for Greeks

Two words describe life for the Deke House in Chapel Hill, N.C: challenging environment.

All fraternities are being challenged by the UNC Board of Trustees to wipe out all forms of hazing and what two of the most vocal trustees call "personal servitude." The board threatened that it would push rush back to the winter semester, something we alumni and the IFC opposed strongly. We won that battle but created, in return, a much tougher code of conduct for pledge training. No form of hazing will be tolerated at the DKE House.

As well, fraternities are being challenged by a much more enforcement-minded Chapel Hill fire department. The total number of fire code violations across the fraternity system is down from last fall, but there still are too many houses in violation, including DKE. Working closely with Beta officers and our fire marshal, Jimmy Glenn, we have corrected them all.

In the past year, the number of honor code charges from the student attorney general has risen, and DKE has gotten its fair share. So far each and every significant one has been dismissed.

And, finally, we as a Beta DKE Inc. board are challenging the brothers continually to raise standards for house upkeep, scholarship and extracurricular activities that range from philanthropic fund-raising to old-fashioned band parties.

The good news is that Beta Deke is answering the bell, rising to meet these challenges. We need increased alumni support to help with that, and I am confident we'll answer that bell as well.



"Dad is really excited too," Terry says. "He throws his moneymanaging skills into it all and comes up with some pretty interesting stuff. He compares me to the other talent in the draft and comes up with scatter plot diagrams and other stuff. It's pretty funny."

Terry's mom and two sisters are also excited for him and his future, though for now his mom is happy just to have him home in Dallas again. After attending military school and UNC, where football kept him at school during the summers, having Terry home again for an extended period has been a treat.

By the end of April, Terry should know where his immediate future lies. Being drafted by an NFL team will be the fulfillment of one goal and the start of some new ones.

"My goals are to make an NFL team, to start and to win," he says. "Our records at Carolina were not always as great as we would have liked, so winning is important to me now."

Terry's DKE brothers will watch with interest to see which team nabs him and will cheer for his success. ■
