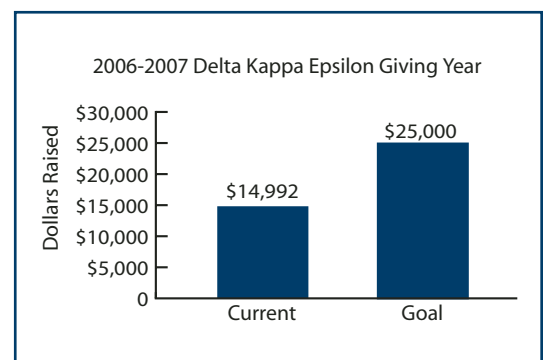

The Beta DKE, Inc. Board held its April meeting on April 14, 2007, and it was a very productive gathering. A summary of the items discussed is as follows (please contact me for more details, if you so desire). (1) Meg Miller, cook and house mother for our active chapter for over 11 years, has agreed to accept additional responsibility as Property Manager. She will work with the board to ensure our physical plant is cared for appropriately. (2) The finances of the board and the active chapter are in good shape, but there is always room for improvement. (3) Several items were identified by Meg Miller and **Robert Poitras '94** as priority needs for our physical plant upkeep and will be addressed as resources allow. One particular change of note, the house will be closed during the summer so that the residential rooms can be repainted and fixed, as necessary. Once the active members return in the fall, they will be required to sign a housing con-

tract and provide a security deposit to live in the house. (4) The active chapter updated the board on various items, including philanthropic activities engaged in by the membership (most notably the successful 2nd Annual Si Sitterson Memorial Golf Tournament which took place on April 13, 2007).

I encourage all of our alumni to continue to provide as many names for the Fall Fraternity Rush period. August will be here before we know it, and we are hoping to field yet another strong freshman class to build upon the past two years. It is crucial for our alumni to submit as many names as possible for us to continue our success. 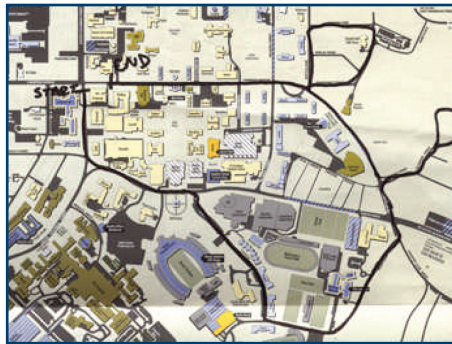

Upon returning from winter break, the officers sat down and laid out a plan that requires a ten hour service minimum per semester per member. So far, the results appear to be promising. We have had brothers actively involved in both the new Kidzu Children's Museum on Franklin Street, Habitat for Humanity and various other projects. As the semester comes to a close, we hope to finish strong and have all the brothers complete this service requirement.

In conjunction with our individual service requirements, we have completed the 2nd Annual Si Sitterson Memorial Golf Tournament, held on April 13, 2007. We raised a little over 7,000 dollars, a 40%
