### Wife of Chip Hagan '70 Wins Senate Seat in One of the Biggest Upsets of the 2008 Election Cycle

#### Kay Hagan Defeated Elizabeth Dole for 2008 Senate Seat

On November 4, 2008, **Chip Hagan '70** and his three children anxiously watched as his wife, Kay, went on to defeat the current Senator of North Carolina, Elizabeth Dole. Many people had doubted her efforts to take the Senate seat away from Dole, but Kay prevailed with the help of her team, her

children, Jeanette, Tilden and Carrie, and most importantly, her husband.

Chip met Kay while both were attending law school at Wake Forest University. After working for NCNB and helping people plan for their loved ones' long term security and care, she decided to leave after their first child was born to commit to being a full-time mother.

She continued to stay active in the community, leading Girl Scout groups, teaching Sunday school classes, and helping out at the Moses Cone Hospital. She then went on to become the Guilford County manager for Governor Hunt's 1992 and 1996 gubernatorial campaigns. She also won the 1998 Senate seat for the 32<sup>nd</sup> district, representing Greensboro.

She then went on to prepare her campaign for 2008, in which she upset three other Senate hopefuls to take the Democratic nomination

and subsequently the Senate seat right out of Dole's hands.

Her win was named one of the biggest upsets in the 2008 election cycle, with some commentators calling her campaign the best run that year.

And in her first speech made after winning the 2008 election, Kay had this to say about Chip, for helping her achieve her goal every step of the way: "And of course to my husband Chip, the best husband any woman could ask for. No one has been a bigger supporter, a bigger cheerleader or a better partner in this journey. I could not have done any of this without his humor, his perspective and his love. And I've said it countless times over the last year, but Chip made the difference in this election. It's nice to have a husband that can vote for you!"

### In Memory

#### Henry Wilson '54 Remembers a Lifelong DKE Friend, Tom Stokes '54

*Thank you to **Henry Wilson '54** for submitting the following letter, which he sent to his high school after the untimely death of **Col. Thomas M. Stokes '54**, Henry's pledge brother at the DKE house. The two had previously been classmates at St. Andrews School in Middletown, DE. Henry hopes that any brothers who knew Tom will appreciate this remembrance.*

Tom arrived at SAS in the fourth form after I had been there a year, and as time went on, we became good friends playing six man JV and varsity football together. In the spring, he played tennis but really showed his stuff on the wrestling. So, he was a three letter man of great ability and courage.

Around SAS graduation, my father, a UNC graduate, drove Tom, Mort Clark and I down to Chapel Hill to look the place over and Tom and I were later accepted and matriculated in the fall of 1950. Mort, a Virginia boy all the way, went to UVA.

Tom and I, along with our SAS classmate Jack ("Country Boy") Keller, lived together in

a rooming house on the edge of town during our freshman year while we learned about college life, adult beverages and the like. Tom also went out for the wrestling team. The two of us joined DKE and basically had a wonderful four years. Again, I do not recall Tom losing any matches, certainly not in his last two years. I vividly remember one match against an all-conference hotshot from Duke. The whole fraternity piled into cars and went to Durham to support our boy against this really cocky Dukie. When they "tied up," I thought we were watching a boxing match and I'll bet their ears rang for a long time. Short story, a tough match but Tommy-boy whipped that guy decisively. I can't remember whether he pinned him or not.

We did not keep in touch much after college. We had been NROTC students and I spent my two years of active duty on a destroyer escort but true to his toughness, tom went into the Marines and had quite a career. I saw him once or twice a good many years after college and I said to him, "you

must have seen some scary stuff." He replied, "no big deal." Well, his obit, along with many other medals, states that he won the silver star and the bronze star for bravery in combat during 13 months. in Vietnam. i think this tells us what kind of man Tommy Stokes was.

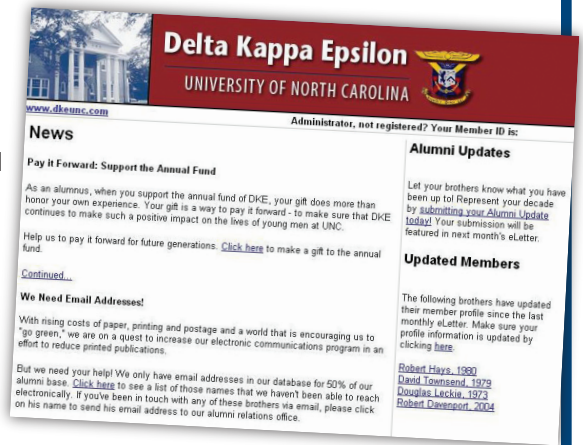

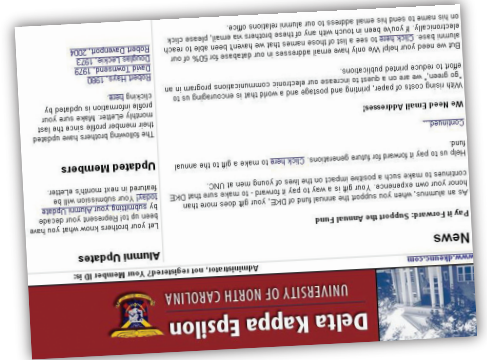
