Active Brothers Welcome New Pledges, Raise GPA

The DKE house currently has 61 active brothers after graduating a senior class of 18. This fall we recruited 21 young men who are currently going through the pledge process, including 11 men from out of state and seven legacies. It is our belief that our size of around 80 allows us to most effectively operate and thrive.

The house hosted its parents' weekend September 27 and 28. Each pledge class hosted their families together at restaurants around Chapel Hill for a pledge class dinner and then met up with the rest of the fraternity back at DKE for dancing and socializing.

The next day, brothers and parents enjoyed a tailgate prior to kickoff and music and barbecue following the game.

This past spring, we raised our chapter cumulative GPA to a 3.150 from a 2.907 and had a spring semester GPA of 3.212. This was thanks to the leadership of Scott Smith, Vice President RI Barrett '14, Academic Chair Sutton Alford '15, and previous president Russell Hardin '13. All of the actives really worked hard to get their grades up and represent the fraternity proudly. With our current academic plan we are on track for future improvement.

Recognized for Rebuilding the DKE House

1851 Award Recipient Rick Hopkins '91 Was a Key Fundraiser in 2001 House Renovation

The 1851 Distinguished Alumni Award is given every year to an alumnus who has shown extraordinary interest and love for the Beta Chapter of Delta Kappa Epsilon. The Alumni Board of Directors of Beta DKE selects a particular man whom they believe has given back the same amount of time and effort that the DKE House once gave to him. For his outstanding efforts in the rebuilding of the DKE house, which was completed in 2001, **Rick Hopkins '91** is this year's recipient of the 1851 Award.

Frederick "Rick" Hopkins, moved from Texas to North Carolina when he was 16 years old and attended high school at Woodberry Forest. After high school, Rick's fast feet earned him a spot on the track team at University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, where he ran the 400 meters for a few years. Track was his sport, but the DKE house was his passion and where he spent the majority of his time. Rick was one of 21 pledge brothers in the Class of '91 and recollects on living in the DKE house as if it were yesterday: "We spent many nights in the awesome DKE

basement... and when you live in the best house on campus with 20 of your best friends, it's hard not to have a good time!" Whether they were hanging out on the second floor landing or going Sutton's every other day senior year, Rick and his pledge brothers were always having a good time at the DKE house.

The DKE house as we see it today is undoubtedly due to the work and dedication of Rick Hopkins. Working alongside **Tee Bauer '66** and a past 1851 Award recipient, Rick and Tee raised an exceptional amount of money to rebuild the walls of the DKE house to what it used to be. Rick and Tee raised an unheard of amount of money, roughly \$2.5 million, for the reconstruction process that was finished in 2001. Living and working in Charlotte, Rick made a conscious effort to drive over two hours to Chapel Hill once a week to meet with architects, builders, and oversee the building process.

"The rebuilding of the [DKE] house was a balancing act...we wanted a house that was rock solid, but also met the needs of students," Rick says. "We wanted to keep

the basement, especially the dance floor, but we ran into new building codes that had to be accounted for." New codes meant new problems that had to constantly be solved during building. However, the main focus of the house was the staircase. "In the old house, the staircase was the central focus of the house and we wanted to bring that back...it's the first thing you see as you walk through the front door and it's the thing that everyone remembers," Rick says.

And Rick could not be more right...the staircase was an essential component to both the old and new houses and it is what Dekes remember about the house. What Dekes will also remember is the dedication and hard work Rick Hopkins put into rebuilding the DKE house. His name is now engraved on the 1851 Distinguished Alumni Award plaque in the chapter room: a room that he worked so actively to rebuild. We thank Rick for all that he's done for he is a major reason the DKE house is still the best on campus.
