

GAMMA XI SCHOLARSHIPS EXCEL!

Thirty-seven **Patterson Scholarships** were awarded during the past two semesters from the Patterson Trust for Academic Excellence maintained by the Sigma Chi Foundation. Now in its 18th year, approximately 680 Gamma Xi Sigs have received the monetary stipends based on maintaining a 3.0 GPA or achieving a 3.0 for that semester. The awards are made twice year, based on each semester's grades. This significant legacy was established by the late Paul S. and Beulah Patterson. A representative at the Sigma Chi Foundation has related to me in our discussions that the UW Gamma Xi scholarship program is one of the top funded ones of our 240+ chapters. Gamma

Additionally, the **Ward Family Sigma Chi Scholarships** are given each semester to brothers who achieve a minimum 3.0 for that semester and are from states east of the Mississippi. The scholarships

were established by the late Dixie Ward whose husband, Orland, sons Tex and Rick, and grandson Matt are Sigma Chis. Twenty-nine Ward Family Scholarships were awarded during this same two-semester period. Since the initial awards, some 97 awards have been made. Since the corpus of the fund was made during the State of Wyoming matching certain qualifying gifts, the original amount of the gift was initially doubled.

Also, the **Rudy Unguren Memorial Scholarship** is awarded annually to the graduating senior who has the most improved GPA since his first semester, freshman year. This year the award was split between **Connor Bergman** and **John Westenhoff**. The scholarship was established in '19 to honor Rudy, a Gamma Xi Sig, by his parents, John and MaryLou Unguren.






